GPA and Related Procedures

- Grades and credits are posted at the end of each semester. Each semester is worth 5 credits; most FUHSD classes are yearlong (10 credits) and meet for 150 instructional hours.
- Coursework from non-accredited or out-of-country schools are transferred as Pass/Fail.
- GPA is calculated at the end of each semester (A=4; B=3; C=2; D=1; F=0). Final semester grade marks include letter grades only and no +/- scale option.
- Three GPA's are identified on the transcript, all unweighted:
 - Cumulative GPA (all grades 9-12)
 - 9-12 Academic A-G courses grades
 - 10-12 Academic A-G courses grades
- Individual class rank is not reported. The grade distribution chart below shows the number of students in each unweighted, cumulative 9-12 GPA category.

Applied Academics includes Living Skills, Business, Career Technical Education, and Work-Experience. Fine Arts include Art, Music, and Drama. Due to budgetary constraints, students are generally limited to one course per subject area per year. Students in the Fremont Union High School District typically take six courses each year, unless there is space available in lower enrolled classes to allow a student to take seven classes. In addition to their coursework, some students choose to take courses through Concurrent Enrollment at one of five local community colleges. This coursework is typically not included on the FUHSD transcript.




Lynbrook is a comprehensive, 4-year, suburban public school on a modified block schedule, offering a well-rounded educational program to students from West San Jose and a portion of northern Saratoga. The vision of the school is to create a dynamic environment of respect and achievement where all can learn deeply, apply their knowledge and contribute purposefully. The Lynbrook Guidance Program consists of three full-time counselors as well as two part-time College and Career Advisors who engage with students, parents, and staff to deliver a comprehensive guidance program that personalizes the planning and counseling experience based on each student's needs and postsecondary goals.

Due to the extraordinary circumstances resulting from COVID-19 school closures, Fremont Union High School District adopted a district-wide Credit/No Credit structure for Spring 2020. For SY 20-21 courses were taught in a combination of remote and in-person instruction due to COVID-19. Per California AB104 legislation, there was an option for families to convert letter grades earned in SY 20-21 to "Pass/No Pass".
